

Periodontal (gum) disease, including gingivitis and periodontitis, are serious infections that if left untreated can lead to tooth loss. The word periodontal literally means "around the tooth." Periodontal disease is a chronic bacterial infection that affects the gums and bone supporting the teeth.

Periodontal disease can affect one tooth or many teeth. It begins when the bacteria in the plaque (the sticky, colorless films that constantly forms on your teeth) causes gums to become inflamed.



IMPLANT DENTISTRY

WHAT ARE DENTAL IMPLANTS?

A dental implant is an artificial tooth root that a periodontist places into your jaw to hold a replacement tooth or bridge. Dental implants are an ideal option for people in good general oral health who have lost a tooth or teeth due to periodontal disease, an injury, or some other reason.

Restoring missing teeth with dental implants is the science of osseointegration. Patients who have lost their teeth to periodontal disease, injury, tooth decay, or are congenitally missing teeth, may benefit from dental implants. Dental implants are substitutes for natural tooth roots, and rely on bone for support. Implants give replacement teeth a more stable base. They can replace a single tooth, multiple teeth, or all teeth in the mouth. They are made of ultra-light titanium, and some are coated with a bone-like substance called hydroxyapetite. They are usually 3-6 mm in diameter and 8-20 mm in length.



DENTAL IMPLANTS F.A.Q.

WILL I HAVE PAIN DURING MY SURGERY?

The area of implant placement will be completely anesthetized before the start of treatment so you will feel minimal pressure but no pain. We also offer oral sedation to help with relaxation and ease anxiety.

WHAT KIND OF ANESTHETICS ARE USED?

Depending on your systemic condition, we use different kinds of anesthetics. Some procedures require longer lasting anesthetics that contain epinephrine. For some individuals with extreme dental phobia, we offer intravenous and general anesthesia services by an independent anesthesiologist at a separate cost.

WHAT PROBLEMS WILL I EXPERIENCE POST OPERATIVELY? WHAT PRESCRIPTION WILL I RECEIVE?

You may experience some post surgical tenderness and pain from the surgery areas between 1 to 5 days after the procedure is completed. Immediately after the surgery, we will give you pain medication to control pain and post-operative sensitivity. Depending on your systemic conditions, we may prescribe different medications but we typically prescribe Amoxicillin, Peridex, Vicodin, or Motrin.

WHAT SHOULD BE AVOIDED AFTER SURGERY?

Consumption of alcoholic beverages, spicy foods, excessive exercise, and smoking increase the pain and prolong the healing period. Maintaining an adequate diet after the surgery is advised. Drink plenty of liquids post-operatively to replenish blood loss. You should chew on the opposite side of surgical areas and avoid hard foods.

WHAT STEPS ARE INVOLVED IN PREPARATION FOR DENTAL IMPLANTS?

Prior to implant placement, the following steps may be taken:

- 1. Patient evaluation and clinical exam
- 2. Study models are taken and x-ray stints are fabricated
- 3. Appropriate X-Rays are taken with aid of SimPlant software
- 4. Fabrication of surgical stints
- 5. Consultation with restorative dentists and laboratory for restoration

HOW LONG WILL MY IMPLANT TREATMENT TAKE?

Generally, after implant placement, bone needs to be given a period of 1-2 months to heal and adhere around the implant. Certain areas with augmented bone may require 4-6 months of healing. In some rare cases, if bone is dense enough, minimally invasive surgical techniques may be used and the implant can be loaded immediately after surgery with a temporary crown.

ORAL SURGERY

WILL I HAVE PAIN DURING MY SURGERY?

We use adequate amounts of appropriate anesthetics during your surgery to wholly contain pain during surgery. We also offer sedation to help minimize the anxiety sometimes associated with the administration of local anesthetics.

WHAT KIND OF ANESTHETICS ARE USED?

Depending on your systemic condition, we use different kinds of anesthetics. Some procedures require longer lasting effects and the use of epinephrine may be necessary for individuals with extreme dental phobia. We also offer intravenous and general anesthesia services administered by an independent anesthesiologist at your own expense.

WHAT SHOULD I AVOID AFTER SURGERY?

Consumption of alcoholic beverages and spicy foods, engaging in excessive exercise, and smoking increase the pain and prolong the healing period. Maintaining an adequate diet after surgery is advised. Drink plenty of liquids post-operatively to replenish blood loss. You should chew on the side opposite of the surgical site and avoid hard foods.

WHAT IF I EXPERIENCE BLEEDING AFTER A TOOTH EXTRACTION?

Bleeding after an extraction is normal and slight bleeding may be noticed for up to 24 hours after surgery. Apply pressure with sterile gauze, and remove the gauze gently. You can hold the gauze in place for up to an hour to prevent further bleeding. If you continue to have bleeding, contact your dentist or surgeon. They may instruct you to bite on a moistened black tea bag. The presence of tannic acid (from the tea) has been shown to reduce bleeding and assist with clotting.

WHAT IF I EXPERIENCE SWELLING AFTER SURGERY?

Swelling is a normal response after various types of surgery. You may use an ice pack on the outside of your face for the first 24 hours after oral surgery. Swelling is generally completely resolved 7 to 10 days following the procedure. Stiffness in the facial muscles is also normal and may be noticed for up to 10 days after oral surgery. Slight bruising is also common. If you have any questions about swelling, or if your swelling persists after 3 days, contact our office.

WILL I FEEL PAIN AFTER THE PROCEDURE?

Pain after oral surgery varies depending on the procedure. Your doctor will prescribe any necessary medication to manage pain. Follow the instructions carefully and always consult with your doctor before taking any over-the-counter medications along with your prescriptions. If you have been prescribed antibiotics, always take all of the antibiotics prescribed to you to prevent infection.

HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE TO FULLY RECOVER?

Rest is recommended for at least two days following oral surgery. Physical activity is not recommended for two to three days after your surgery. Typically, you should be able to resume normal daily activities after 48 hours.

SHOULD I AVOID BRUSHING AND FLOSSING AFTER SURGERY?

Vigorous brushing, rinsing and spitting should be avoided for 24 hours. Brush gently and floss the non-affected areas if you are able to open your mouth wide enough. Lightly rinse your mouth with warm water, avoiding mouthwash. Let the water fall out of your mouth on its own - do not spit as this may break clots that may be forming in the surgically treated area. After 24 hours, consider rinsing with a saline or salt water solution to promote healing.

COSMETIC DENTISTRY

Cosmetic Dentistry is a field of dentistry that focuses on the improvement and appearance of your teeth and smile. This improvement to your smile brings many benefits to your life that go far beyond the appearance of your teeth and smile. These techniques utilize the latest in technology to give you a beautiful white smile and to give your teeth an attractive appearance, while also protecting your health. We offer all kinds of cosmetic dentistry procedures.

WHITENING

ZOOM WHITENING

Teeth whitening is one of the most popular procedures available in cosmetic dentistry. Millions of people have discovered the benefits of whitening their smiles, including an improved appearance and a boost in self-confidence. However, many people do not realize that the most effective and simplest whitening treatments are those performed right at the dentist's office. These types of whitening treatments are also known as in-office whitening.

In-office teeth whitening can usually be performed in one visit, in about 90 minutes. Often a peroxide-based gel will be applied to the teeth, which penetrates the tooth enamel and bleaches deeply-embedded stains. By removing these deep stains, the entire tooth gains a lustrous white appearance.

WHITENING F.A.Q.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN AT-HOME TEETH WHITENING AND IN-OFFICE TEETH WHITENING?

For very lightly stained teeth, at-home treatments may be effective; however, for deeply stained teeth, in-office whitening is usually far more effective.

HOW LONG WILL THE TEETH WHITENING EFFECT LAST?

The beautiful and brilliant white color will last some time, depending on your dental hygiene routine and the foods you consume. The better you are able to stay away from staining agents, such as coffee, red wine, smoking, etc. - the longer your results will last post treatment.

DOES INSURANCE COVER THE COST OF TEETH WHITENING PROCEDURES?

No, dental insurance typically does not cover the cost of teeth whitening procedures.

HOW MANY TIMES CAN I SAFELY HAVE MY TEETH PROFESSIONALLY WHITENED?

You can have the teeth whitening procedure up to 2 times per year.

IS EVERYONE A GOOD CANDIDATE FOR TEETH WHITENING?

Teeth whitening is not recommend for children under the age of 18, or for women during pregnancy. Likewise, teeth whitening is not effective nor advised for those with gum disease, veneers or crowns, or for individuals with worn out enamel on their teeth.

VENEERS

Dental veneers cover cosmetically unattractive, damaged or unstable teeth. Veneers are fashioned to mask unsightly problems such as cracking, chipping, staining, or other irregularities in teeth. The use of veneers is one of the less-invasive methods used to solve image-based dental issues and give you a beautiful, uniform smile.

SNAP-ON SMILE

Snap-On Smile was invented by a dentist who realized that not everyone can afford a total Hollywood smile makeover. Snap-On Smile's unique, proprietary formula of high-tech dental resin makes it very thin yet extremely strong. It is a fabricated perfect set of teeth that literally fits right over your own teeth to give you a beautiful, natural looking smile-even if you have stains, chips, gaps, or missing teeth.

At your first visit the dentist will examine your teeth, decide if you are a good candidate for Snap-On Smile and if so, discuss the best aesthetic look for your face and mouth. The dentist will then take an impression of your teeth, with no pain, no shots or drilling whatsoever, and send your impressions to a special lab to have your Snap-On Smile custom made just for you. Approximately three weeks later, the dentist will fit your Snap-On Smile and make any adjustments (if necessary). You'll then be shown how to pop your new smile on or off and remember - you can eat with it, drink with it, and wear it all day (as long as your remove it before going to sleep).

DENTAL BONDING

Dental bonding is a procedure that uses a composite resin to "sculpt" teeth into perfect shape. With dental bonding, chipped or cracked teeth can be reshaped and look brand new. Stained teeth receive a complete "face lift" with bonding, and even gapped teeth can sometimes be repaired with the use of this technique.

Dental bonding begins with a mild etching solution that is applied to the teeth to create a bondable surface. A pliable composite resin is then placed on the teeth and sculpted into the proper shape. This resin is very malleable until it hardens, and it can be colored to match your own tooth's color exactly so as to appear completely natural.

DENTAL BONDING F.A.Q.

What can dental bonding fix?

Dental bonding can help with gaps between teeth, cover discolored teeth, and reshape chipped teeth. While bonding will not solve all of your dental problems, it can be used to repair a wide array of dental issues.

Will it hurt?

Dental bonding is a procedure that is well-tolerated by most patients. Since bonding does not involve any surgical procedures, it can be performed quite painlessly. In fact, even patients with systemic issues that are prohibited from dental surgical procedures can benefit from bonding.

INLAYS & ONLAYS

Inlays and onlays are dental techniques which offer great results in covering problem tooth areas, but allow you to keep the original tooth intact more so than crowns or fillings.

Dental inlays are composed of porcelain, gold, or composite resin. They are custom-made to fit inside the cusp of a damaged tooth. Inlays cover the portion of the damaged tooth which is visible and prevent any further decay from entering the tooth.

Dental onlays are similar to inlays but cover more extensive areas of the tooth, often the entire top portion. Onlays are also custom-fitted to match the exact contours of the tooth's surface, and are placed and filed so that they blend with the rest of the tooth exactly. Like inlays, onlays are attractive in appearance and virtually undetectable in the mouth.

INLAYS & ONLAYS F.A.Q.


How long is the procedure?

Both onlays and inlays require two dental visits. In the first visit, the old filling is removed or the decayed area cleaned, and measurements are taken for the production of the custom-fitted inlay or onlay. On the second visit, the inlay or onlay is placed, shaped and polished.

TOOTH COLORED FILLINGS

Cavities are the most common dental problem. Millions of dental fillings are placed each year to stop cavities and strengthen teeth. While patients formerly had no choice when it came to the type or color of their fillings, there are new techniques available now which make fillings far less unsightly, especially in highly visible areas.

One way to reduce the visibility of fillings is to use new tooth colored fillings. These new fillings are made of resin or porcelain, which can easily be tinted to match the tooth's natural color. Once the filling is set and polished, it is



In the past, dental fillings were made of a mixture of a metal, offen silver, and other fillers to provide strength. This metallic mixture worked well for fillings because it was highly resistant to decay, hardened quickly, and offered great protection for the affected tooth.

However, in recent years, tooth colored fillings have become a much more widely used option. These restorations do not use metal but rather strong materials, such as fiberglass, to give them support and strength. Like metal fillings, they are very resistant to decay, but they also have the added benefit of being invisible in the mouth.

COSMETIC DENTISTRY F.A.Q.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN LUMINEERS AND TRADITIONAL VENEERS?

Unlike traditional veneers, Lumineers are ultra thin and thus the placement of Lumineers involves no shots, no drilling of sensitive tooth structure, and no pain.

AM I A GOOD CANDIDATE FOR SNAP-ON SMILE?

Only with a thorough examination can a dentist properly assess if a patient is a good candidate for Snap-On-Smile.

AM I A GOOD CANDIDATE FOR ZOOM! TEETH WHITENING?

A consultation is required to determine which whitening product is the best fit for you.

WHY SHOULD I CHANGE MY SILVER FILLINGS?

Silver or amalgam fillings contain mercury, which has been linked to a number of health problems. Composite (tooth-colored) fillings are placed using color-match

technology so that the filling matches the natural color of the tooth, providing a much better aesthetic result and without the use of hazardous materials.

WHAT IS TOOTHBRUSH ABRASION?

Toothbrush abrasion occurs when the surface enamel of a tooth has been damaged due to brushing too aggressively or using a harsh (nonsoft bristled) toothbrush.

WILL MY INSURANCE COVER COSMETIC PROCEDURES?

Some insurance plans do cover certain cosmetic procedures. For specific assessment of insurance coverage, you must come in for a consultation or contact your insurance provider.



LUMINEERS®

LUMINEERS

Lumineers are a type of porcelain veneer that is as thin as possible, but still solves aesthetic dental issues. The structure of Lumineers is so thin that no pre-filing of the teeth is usually necessary. By avoiding this preparatory phase, teeth retain their integrity, and the veneers can be removed at some point in the future if desired. However, some situations require thicker veneers and tooth filing may be unavoidable. Our dentist can explain the options in your case.

LUMINEERS F.A.Q.

HOW IS LUMINEERS™ BY CERINATE[®] DIFFERENT THAN TRADITIONAL VENEER PROCEDURES?

LUMINEERS is unique in that it is like a thin shell (approximately .2 mm) and super translucent. These veneers are applied to teeth for the most natural look possible. Traditional veneers are fused or bonded to teeth and, generally, your dentist will need to grind down your own tooth for a good fit. Since LUMINEERS are so thin, little to no tooth reduction is necessary. In addition, LUMINEERS resist micro-leakage and micro-cracking.

I'VE HEARD THAT VENEER PROCEDURES HURT, IS THAT TRUE WITH LUMINEERS?

It's true that because most traditional veneer procedures require a substantial amount of tooth structure removal, there may be some pain and discomfort involved. However, LUMINEERS are completely different because there is no need for grinding, cutting or filing of teeth in almost all cases. Consequently, no anesthetic or numbing shots are needed. Plus, no uncomfortable temps are required while you wait for your LUMINEERS to be created. Once the procedure is completed, there is no post-placement discomfort or sensitivity, which means they will look natural and feel comfortable from the start.

I THINK I NEED BRACES, BUT I REALLY DON'T WANT TO GO THROUGH THE INCONVENIENT, UNSIGHTLY AND TIME-INTENSIVE PROCESS. CAN I GET LUMINEERS INSTEAD?

Perhaps. LUMINEERS can change the shape and alignment of teeth, making them look straighter and more uniform.

HOW LONG WILL LUMINEERS LAST?

LUMINEERS porcelain veneers have unparalleled longevity. Clinical testing shows that a LUMINEERS procedure can last and look great for up to 20 years.

WITH LUMINEERS, DO I NEED TO USE A SPECIAL TOOTHPASTE OR FLOSS A DIFFERENT WAY?

LUMINEERS is similar in structure to real tooth enamel. Consequently, you can continue to brush with your favorite toothpaste and floss regularly as you did before you had LUMINEERS. You should always try to choose a low-abrasion toothpaste that will remove plaque, stains and tartar gently, but effectively.

WITH LUMINEERS, CAN I STILL CHEW GUM AND EAT MY FAVORITE STICKY FOODS LIKE CORN OR CANDY?

Yes, because LUMINEERS is laid over original teeth in the most durable way possible. However, you should continue routine visits to your dentist.

GENERAL & COSMETIC DENTISTRY F.A.Q.

CAN I GET MY TEETH CLEANED ON MY FIRST VISIT TO YOUR OFFICE?

We never guarantee a cleaning on the first visit because a doctor must first assess what kind of cleaning is necessary. Also, in some cases, certain insurance companies don't authorize a cleaning at a new facility without a comprehensive exam performed first.

HOW OFTEN DO I NEED X-RAYS?

X-Rays are recommended every 6 months.

HOW OFTEN SHOULD I SEE A GENERAL DENTIST IF MY TEETH ARE IN GOOD HEALTH?

A check-up is recommended twice a year, or every six months. In some cases the dentist may recommend a visit every three or four months.

HOW OFTEN SHOULD I GET A CLEANING?

Depending on your overall oral hygiene habits, your doctor may recommend a cleaning every three, four, or six months.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A REGULAR CLEANING AND A DEEP CLEANING?

A regular cleaning, or prophylaxis, is the polishing and scaling of the tooth surface in the absence of periodontal disease. A deep cleaning is more invasive and includes scaling and root planing below the gumline to remove bacteria above and below the gumline.

WHY SHOULD I GET COMPOSITE FILLINGS INSTEAD OF AMALGAM?

Amalgam fillings must be held in structurally, meaning the dentist in many cases must remove more tooth structure than just the decayed portion. Composite fillings not only offer a better aesthetic result, but they are bonded to the tooth structure such that only the decayed area needs be removed - thus better preserving the structural integrity of the natural tooth.

HOW OLD DOES MY CHILD HAVE TO BE TO START SEEING A GENERAL DENTIST?

Generally patients transition from a pediatric dentist (or Pedodontist) to a general dentist around age 8. A toddler should be seen by a pediatric dentist when their first tooth comes in.

CAN I HAVE DENTAL WORK DONE WITHOUT THE USE OF ANESTHETICS?

Perhaps. An examination will have to be done to determine if that's possible.

CAN I BE PUT TO SLEEP FOR MY DENTAL TREATMENT?

Perhaps. Your overall health condition will have to be assessed.

WHY WOULD I NEED AN ENDODONTIC PROCEDURE?

Endodontic treatment is necessary when the pulp (the soft tissue inside the root canal) becomes inflamed or infected. The inflammation or infection can have a variety of causes: deep decay, repeated dental procedures on the tooth, or a crack or chip in the tooth. In addition, an injury to a tooth may cause pulp damage even if the tooth has no visible chips or cracks. If pulp inflammation or infection is left untreated, it can cause extreme pain or lead to an abscess.

During regular dental checkups, our dentist will be able to offer a thorough oral examination and take X-rays. These two steps are very important in catching endodontic issues in their earliest stages before it becomes painful for the patient. When caught early, there is also a much better chance of removing diseased cells before they become severely infected and painful.

ROOT CANALS

The American Dental Association claims that as many as 16 million root canals are performed every year in the United States alone. Modern root canals can often be carried out very quickly and with minimal discomfort. During this procedure, a small hole is made in the tooth to extract the diseased pulp. After the infected pulp is treated, a filling is placed to cover the hole and restore the integrity of the tooth. Lastly, a porcelain or gold crown is then placed over the tooth to protect it from further injury as well as to strengthen it.

ORTHODONTICS

Everyone deserves the right to have a straight and beautiful smile. Orthodontic treatments are used to straighten teeth or to correct the alignment of teeth, which if left untreated can lead to speaking or eating problems. Nowadays, it's common for adults to seek these treatments in pursuit of a better smile. Orthodontic treatments provide a more pleasing appearance that help boost a person's self-confidence and self-image.

When patients find themselves with crooked teeth or major gaps, they often wonder what permanent options may be available to them to restore their smile. We offer one of the most advanced straightening systems to date - Invisalign aligners, but we also believe patients should remain informed about traditional metal braces as well.

WHO NEEDS ORTHODONTICS?

Orthodontic treatments are designed to provide relief to those living with crooked teeth, excessive gaps or spacing between teeth, misaligned teeth, or bite problems. These conditions can be the result of many different factors. Teeth can grow abnormally due to genetics or premature loss of baby teeth. Teeth that are broken during childhood can grow incorrectly and cause alignment problems also. These scenarios can lead to overbites or prevent permanent teeth from growing normally.

ORTHODONTIC TREATMENTS

Two popular types of treatments used to straighten and align teeth are traditional metal braces and Invisalign clear aligners. These treatments provide excellent ways to gently shift teeth into alignment during the length of the treatment. Metal braces use a series of metal brackets and wires that are attached to the tooth exterior. The braces are adjusted during each phase of the straightening treatment to accurately straighten and align teeth.

INVISALIGN

The Invisalign system is very different from traditional metal braces. Instead of using a series of metal wires and clamps, Invisalign offers clear plastic trays which are custom-fitted to the patient's mouth. As the series of trays progressively change, the teeth are gradually shifted into proper alignment.

INVISALIGN PROCEDURE

Invisalign aligners are formed from a mold made of your teeth on your first visit. Every Invisalign set is custom-crafted to fit only your mouth. The first set of plastic trays hugs your teeth very closely in their present alignment; however, subsequent trays, which are changed about every two weeks, gradually change the tooth configuration. This gradual changing of the alignment of your teeth actually provides faster results, in many cases, than metal braces.

TRADITIONAL METAL BRACES

Traditional metal braces are very effective at straightening teeth, no matter their condition. This process is carried out by attaching wires to the teeth and then tightening them at regular intervals. Over the course of a few months or years, patients will see their smile transform as their teeth re-align.

BIGGEST ADVANTAGE OF INVISALIGN

One of the biggest advantages of Invisalign is that the trays are clear and virtually invisible in your mouth. This promotes usage by patients who were sometimes not compliant with wearing metal braces. Young people in particular, love the fact that Invisalign is invisible, and are much more likely to enjoy the course of orthodontic treatment than if they are forced to wear visible metal braces. Another advantage of Invisalign is that it can be removed at will, so eating and brushing the teeth is never a problem.

ORTHODONTICS F.A.Q.

HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE FOR ME TO GET STRAIGHT TEETH?

Every case is different and must be assessed by an orthodontist, but generally orthodontic treatment lasts approximately 1-2 years.

WHAT IS INVISALIGN?

Invisalign is an alternative to metal braces that involves the use of clear, custom-made trays that gradually move your teeth as they are worn over the teeth.

WHAT FOODS AM I NOT ALLOWED TO EAT WHEN WEARING TRADITIONAL BRACES?

A list of foods will be provided for you, but generally chewy, sticky and hard foods should be avoided.

WHAT FOODS AM I NOT ALLOWED TO EAT WHEN WEARING INVISALIGN?

Invisalign trays must be removed in order to eat, therefore there are no restrictions in eating associated with the Invisalign system.

HOW MUCH DOES ORTHO TREATMENT COST?

Cost is dependent on the specific case. We offer complimentary consultation with our orthodontist so that the exact cost and length of your treatment may be discussed with you.

CAN I MAKE MONTHLY PAYMENTS?

Yes, we are happy to accommodate in-house as well as third party financing for our orthodontic patients.

WHY DO I NEED TO OBTAIN DENTAL RECORDS FOR ORTHO TREATMENT?

We need to establish starting and finishing points for treatment.

TMJ

Temporomandibular Joint Disorder (TMJ) is a common and painful condition that can cause tenderness on each side of the head near the joints, along the jaw, or in front of the ears. This is the same joint that allows us to talk, chew, and even yawn, so any pain in this area can be debilitating.

Anyone that has recently felt this type of chronic pain should understand what symptoms to look for, why they may be experiencing it, and what TMJ treatment by an experienced dentist may be able to offer you.

ABOUT TMJ

TMJ symptoms include tenderness around the jaw, pain near the ears, difficulty chewing, aching facial pain, a locking of the joint, chronic headaches, an uncomfortable bite, or uneven chewing patterns

There are many causes for this condition that patients should also remain aware of. Some of the most common causes include an erosion of the disk that aligns the jaw, damaged cartilage, trauma to the area, grinding of the teeth, and arthritis. Many of those in need of TMJ treatment often report they suffer from one or more of these catalysts.

In rare cases, this ailment may go away without any professional TMJ treatment. For those that continue to suffer from TMJ though, professional treatment by a dentist will most likely be necessary.

Dentists may also prescribe powerful muscle relaxants that may help with headaches and clenching of the jaw. Some of the most severe cases may require Botulinum injections to realign the jaw.

CANCELLATION POLICY

As a courtesy, we attempt to confirm most appointments 48 hours in advance. However, if we are unable to reach you, keeping your appointment is your responsibility.

We require an advance 24-hour notice of cancellation or request to reschedule an appointment. Failure to reschedule or cancel your appointment in this time frame will result in a charge of \$50 per 1/2 hour appointment for general, and \$150 per 1/2 hour appointments with specialists. Please note that all Monday appointments must be canceled by 2 P.M. the preceding Friday or a broken appointment charge will be applied.

As a condition of treatment by this office, financial arrangements must be made in advance. We depend upon timely reimbursement for the costs incurred in rendering care. Financial responsibility on the part of each patient must be determined before treatment. All emergency dental services, or any dental services performed without previous financial arrangements, must be paid for in cash at the time services are performed unless other arrangements are made.

A service charge of 1% per month (18% per annum) on any unpaid balance will be charged on all accounts exceeding 60 days, unless previous written financial arrangements are satisfied.

Any fee estimate for dental care can only be extended for a period of six months from the date of the patient examination.
